## Background

The Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) target the world's eight key development challenges. These goals emerged from the United Nations Millennium Declaration of 2000, a commitment to global development made by the world's leaders and endorsed by the United Nations General Assembly. The MDGs are the set of eight specific, measurable goals that the world has set a course to achieve by 2015.

UNDP's TARGET MDG programme assesses Indonesia's MDG status and provides new opportunities for further progress towards the MDGs through support to research, capacity building workshops and forums, media advocacy and the Government's Poverty Reduction Strategy.

UNDP's TARGET MDGs programme provides a multi-stakeholder platform to better channel efforts towards effective progress on the MDGs in Indonesia. The project works in partnership with:

- The National Development Planning Agency (BAPPENAS)
- The Coordinating Ministry for People's Welfare (MENKOKESRA)
- Central Bureau of Statistics (BPS)
- Civil society organisations (CSOs)
- The private sector
- The media
- Multilateral and bilateral institutions
- The multi-donor Decentralization Support Facility (DSF)

The TARGET MDGs programme will initially focus on five provinces of high poverty incidence: Maluku, Sulawesi Tenggara, Sulawesi Tengah, Nusa Tenggara Barat (NTB) and Nusa Tenggara Timur (NTT).

*Based on experiences and lessons learned in these provinces, TARGET MDGs will expand to further provinces across Indonesia.*



*Achievement of the MDGs will ensure improved opportunity for all.*

## The MDGs in Indonesia

- Over 110 million Indonesians, or 53 percent of the population, live on less than USD 2 per day.
- A full 16 million people (7.5 percent of Indonesia's population) survive on less than USD 1 per day.
- The proportion of the population with sustainable access to clean water and sanitation is only slowly increasing.
- Indonesia's maternal mortality rates 307 per 100,000 remain the highest in Southeast Asia. Indonesia's Papua province has the highest maternal mortality rate in the country.
- HIV/AIDS infection is accelerating sharply across the country, both in Papua and in high risk urban areas.
- Approximately 94 percent of children enrol in primary school, but only 81 percent continue to secondary school.
- Between 1997 and 2000, Indonesia lost 3.5 million hectares of forest annually.

## Objectives

- Strengthen the technical capacity of the government at national and sub-national levels to collect and analyse statistical data required for MDGs benchmarking, target-setting, and monitoring.
- Build the capacity of the government to better assess progress towards the MDGs and human development, focusing on the production and publication of Millennium Development Goal Reports, Human Development Reports and the overall monitoring of MDGs.
- Intensify advocacy efforts through the media, development partners and CSO networks to improve awareness of the MDGs and promote further action among stakeholders.
- Provide support to the Poverty Reduction Strategy as well as MDGs action planning and costing processes at the sub-national level, while providing seed-financing for local community development initiatives in areas critical to the achievement of the MDGs.



## Results

- Data compiled for the 2007 MDG Report.
- Prepare and facilitate a joint stakeholder work plan to assess the quality and constraints of MDG data collection in Indonesia.
- Establish an MDG Monitoring Database.
- Provide ongoing technical support to the 2007 MDG Report.
- Assist in the preparation of National Human Development Report 2008 and provincial Human Development Report (Gorontalo).
- Host multi-stakeholder workshops on the MDGs in five selected provinces.
- Produce and disseminate MDGs Campaign materials, including bilingual introductory materials, MDGs standing calendars, comic book capturing the MDGs, public service announcements, and an MDG Drawing Competition.
- Support for the MDGs "STAND UP" anti-poverty Campaign.
- Establish partnerships with the private sector to better promote the MDGs.
- Build on partnership with the media, such as METRO TV's partnership to promote the MDGs and support to the Asian-Pacific MDG Media Awards 2007.
- Establish partnership with the Inter-faith Alliance for MDGs.
- Build close relationships within Indonesia's civil society network to promote national, provincial and district level ownership of the MDGs and enhanced capacity to influence policies.
- Indosat phone vouchers designed and distributed nationwide to promote the MDGs.
- Establish an MDG Local Economic Development Fund that allows donors, the private sector and local stakeholders to contribute and forge partnerships for action.
- Build partnerships with the private sector to identify innovative ways to deliver sustainable products and services to the poor.
